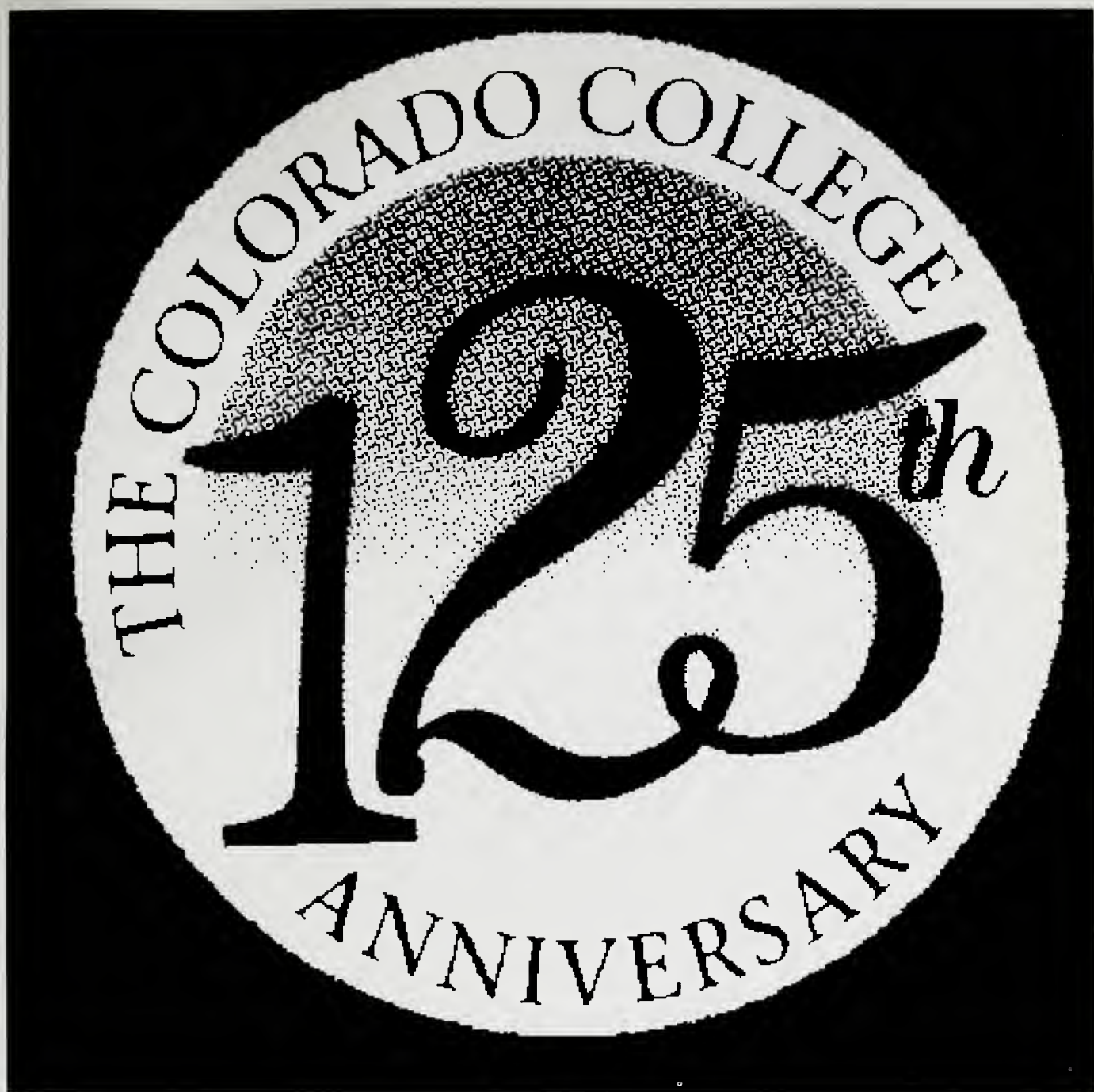

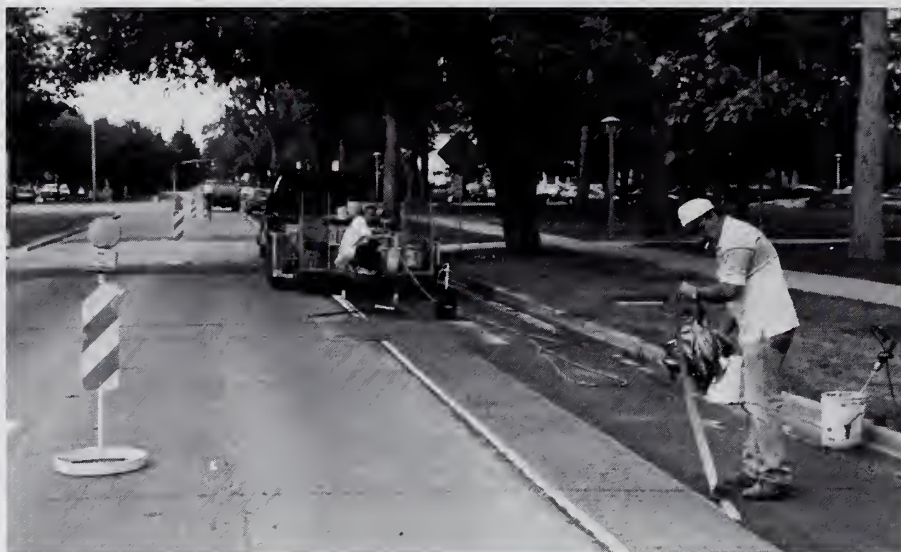

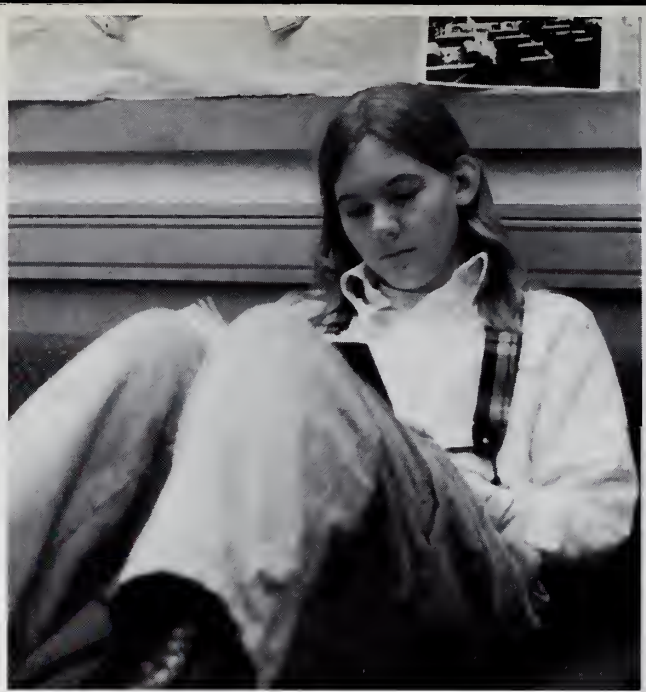

As the student government the Colorado college Campus Association (CCCA) is concerned with all aspects of College life and serves all members of the campus community. CCCA Chartered and recognizes student organizations appoints students to faculty and trustee committees; represents the student body in dialogues with the College administration; funds special projects, chartered organizations and student publications (i.e. the Nugget. you rock CCCA!)

Every Colorado College student is a member of CCCA. The Executive Council is the CCCA governing body. It is composed of 5 elected student positions: President (Ben Mitchell and Maggie Pavlik), Executive Vice President, Student Concerns Vice President, Constitutional Vice President, and Budget Vice President. In addition to these Executive members, 13 district representatives are elected from various residential areas on and off-campus as well as Class Vice-Presidents acting as representatives from each graduating class. The student body elects its representatives annually. One College administrator and one faculty member as well as various ex-officio members are also invited to participate in Council decisions.

The CCCA Council meets three times every block and meetings are open to the entire campus. The first and third meetings are dedicated to campus life and issues; the second meeting is held strictly for funding issues.

Block Five

Distinguished students, parents, faculty, honorees, and administrators of the Colorado College: My name is Maggie Pavlik and I am Ben Mitchell. We serve as the elected Co-Presidents of the Colorado College Campus Association, the student government at CC.

Today we address this assembly in Shove Chapel concerning the very life and mission of our mutual association. Let us pose a question: On this 125th anniversary of the College, to what end are we embarked together as a community of teachers and learners? To answer with a simple statement, we are here to undertake the responsibility of human freedom- to learn our nature as human beings by engaging in a self-conscious, reflective, intelligent, and lifelong activity of human understanding.

The Colorado College is an institution dedicated to the pursuit of the liberal arts and sciences. This form of education focuses not to acquire habits or to train ourselves in a particular function; rather it attempts to continue the sacred mission delivered by Delphic oracle over 2,500 years ago: know thyself. This odyssey into the seas of human self-understanding is the core of liberal learning.

The liberal arts and sciences are founded in the Western Tradition; a tradition which strives toward the ideal of a free society. Liberal society is marked by the principles of individual liberty, personal responsibility, the rule of law, limited government, free market economy, and moral standards.

In our free society, the student of a liberal arts education must study the tradition of her ancestors to, as historian Jaroslav Pelikan remarks, "come to terms with the presence of the traditions from which we are delivered." While much is to be learned from traditional Eastern understanding and non-European cultures, we must not simply dismiss our classical inheritance.

As a liberal learners, we must understand our tradition as a source and a beginning. To use a simile from a man named Luke, "Ask, and it will be given you; search, and you will find; knock, and the door will opened for you. For everyone who asks receives, and when we knock on the door of tradition, we will see a glimmer of scintillating understanding. We must accept this tradition only to question it often and repeatedly; for in it we will find our roots, our natures, and our further understanding.

The Colorado College is a battle ground for ideas. On this moral battleground, we must all decide what we reason right and wrong. In a dialectical engagement, our disagreements reveal our truths, our questions fuel the method, and our answers are only as stable as our rationale. At the heart of our pursuit, we find ourselves asking the most fundamental questions: what does it mean to be human, how does the world function, what is beauty, and so on. In the end, these answers are the basis for our moral choices within the college campus today, and in the world tomorrow.

It is our responsibility as citizens in a free society to ascribe personal understanding to words like "virtue" or "the good life" to determine a basis for debate. We might listen to Augustine's argument in *The Teacher*: "if the one who hears my words sees those things himself with that clean and inner eye of the soul, he knows the things whereof I speak by contemplating them himself, and not by my words." To retain the vitality of the liberal education, we must all take on this responsibility of freedom to learn on our own in this community of knowledge.

In returning to modernity, we conclude. Director and artist Steven Spielberg is a modern day Homer. Recently, I saw the movie *Saving Private Ryan*, a quintessential film about the American combatants in the Normandy invasion, men who fought to preserve our free society over fascism. Normandy, similar to battles like Marathon or Saratoga, demonstrates the survival of liberal principles enduring over other systems of thought.

Colorado College is a gem of our tradition and of liberal learning. Let us not forget the sacrifices made so that we may profit from a "liberal" education. As teachers, let us learn to reexamine our safe theories of understanding- whether this given-knowledge is the understanding of Heisenberg's Principles or the true meaning found in Rousseau's Discourses. As learners, let us challenge ourselves to attempt foreign understanding. Try a class in political theory or leave your safe confidences to sing in the Colorado College Choir. Together, let us strengthen our close community which began 125 years ago. Together, let us return to the ideals of our liberal arts education. With these thoughts in mind, it is our privilege to welcome you to the challenges of this new academic year.
