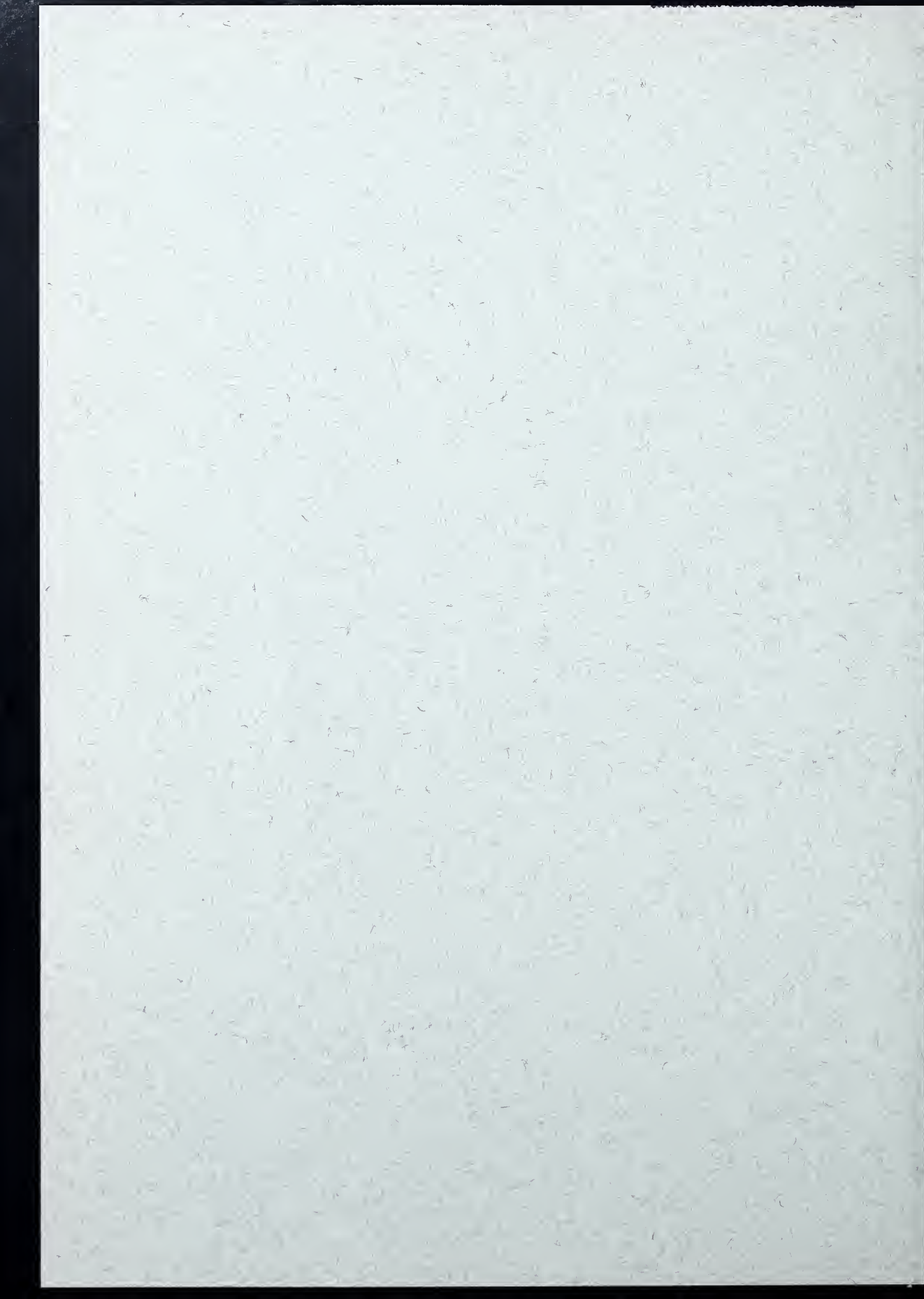

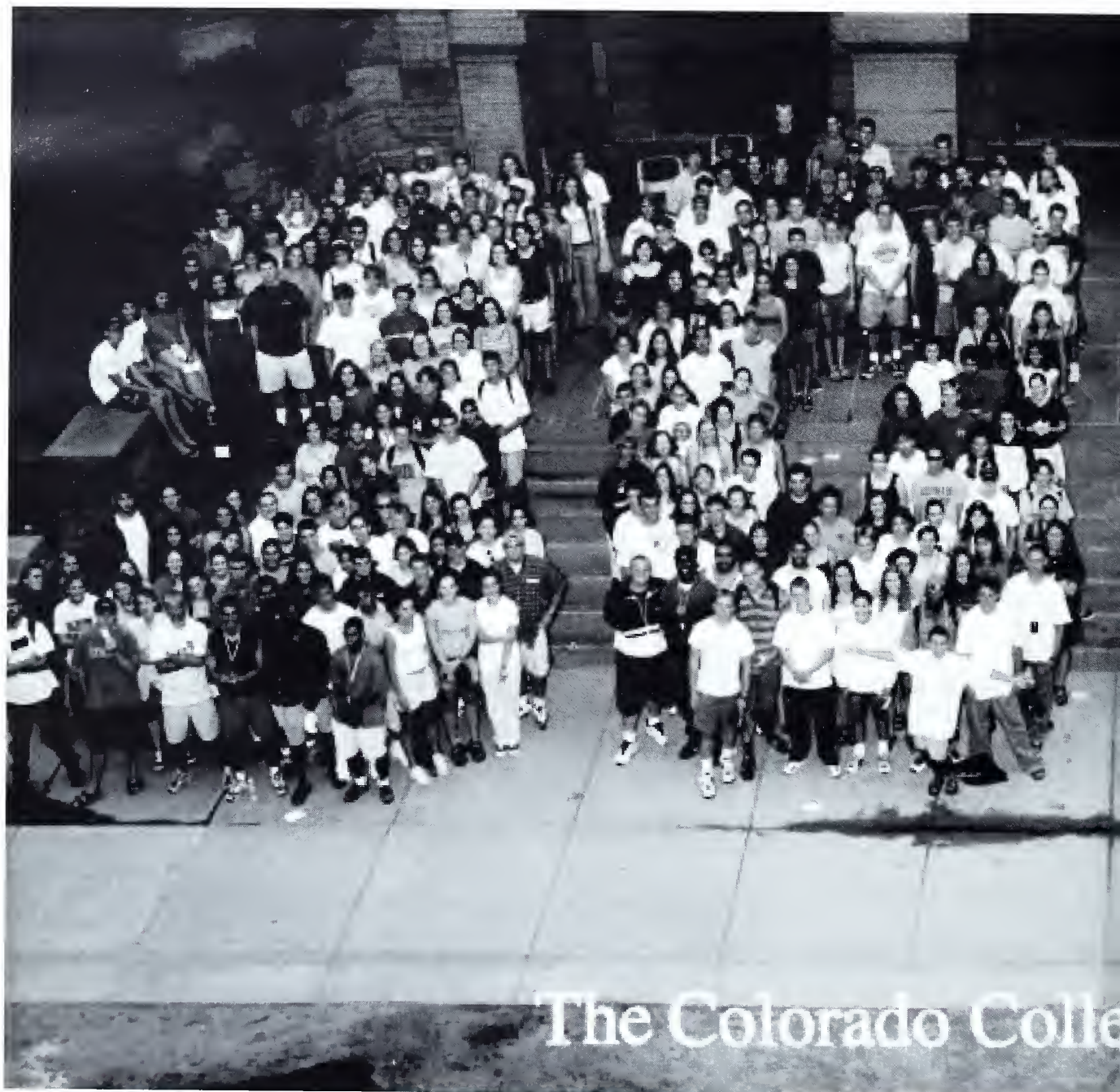

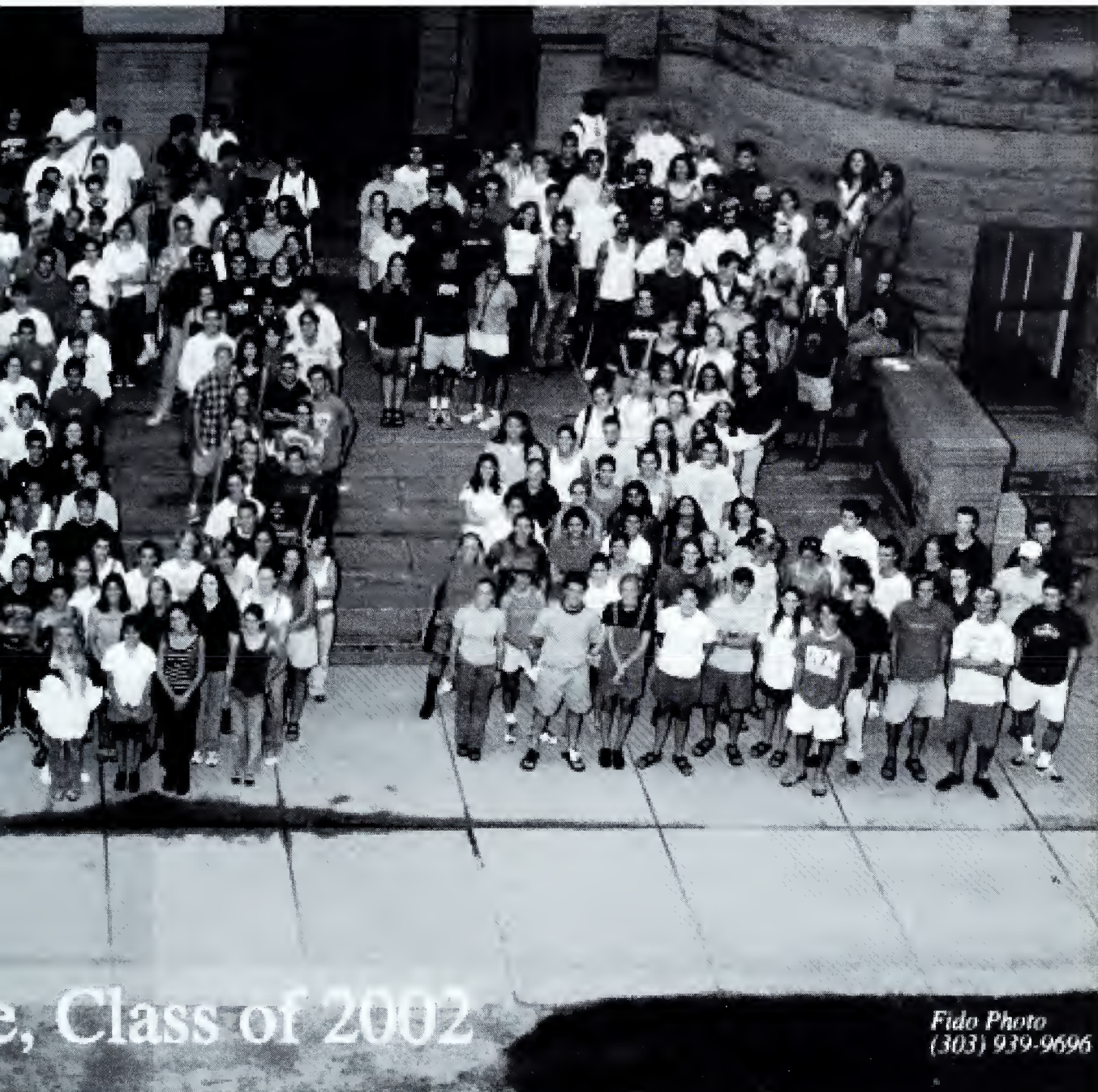

This book was not supposed to have a theme. At the beginning of the year, the farthest thing from my mind was participating in the cliché of a themed yearbook. But things change, and when 9/11 happened, the theme for the year materialized out of the undefined substance of the time. As a nation, as a campus, and as a class, 2002 marked a transition period. We do not carry the idea through the book, instead choosing only to attempt to document photographically the dense character of our school and class (you will notice there is almost no wasted space; we could not avoid resembling the Colorado College way of life) . Nevertheless, we at The Nugget would like 2002 to be remembered as The Turning Point.

2002 was the year that so many Americans, especially of our generation, saw themselves in a new light. Initially, it was only that we joined that vast league of nations that have lost their respective innocence to acts of violence unrestrained by western political tradition. But then, a chain of events swept the nation that caused all of us to examine more closely our economic, diplomatic, and ethical policies. Some recognized 9/11 and its aftermath as the reaping of seed well-sown; others simply did not. And above all, The conundrum that was the War on Terrorism consumed the countries conscience; Some said it was a massacre without dignity, gross unilateralism without responsibility or humility. Others said it was necessary to maintain our sovereignty, security, and preserve our way of life. Either way, our self-definition was challenged and we entered a new chapter in our nation's history.

And under Kathryn Mohrman's administration, CC underwent broad-scale transformation. Architecturally, the new apartments altered the western face of the campus, according to one's view manifesting either irreverence for the hewn stone heritage of the school (not a new tradition in CC architecture) and the prevalent concern for sustainable architecture. New buildings were planned to cater to the growing student dedication to studio arts and environmental studies, both expanding the campus and compacting its center. Due to the president's extensive travel, which alternately endeared and estranged her to the students, faculty, and board of trustees, we gained a sister school and an exchange program at Fudan University in China. Our endowment grew to over 350 million dollars. The Catalyst published the notorious Niggalodeon satire in the spring, leading to a new circulation of dialogue between campus groups, CCA, and Cutler publications, and a renewed conversational focus (both local and national) on the school's commitment to diversity. 2002 also marked another beginning and ending; the end of the beloved Summer Start program and the beginning of the untested Winter-Start program. CC Fair Labor gained ground in the battle with the business office to force Marriott into conceding rights and living wages for its workers. And then, of course, Kathryn resigned, placing the school at the fork of a new road to be defined by the new president, former Ohio Governor Richard Celeste.

2002 is also the year that we as a class were released unto the world. It was a turning point in the young lives of all members of our graduating class- we had a range of aspirations, talents, and paths. and we were newly qualified to pursue them. The future was wide open.

Never let it be said that 2002 did not occur, and follow a most dynamic course. Here is proof.

September 11, 2001

8:45 EDT-American Airlines Flight 11 crashes into the North Tower of the World Trade Center. 92 passengers are onboard.
 9:03 EDT-United Airlines Flight 175 crashes into the South Tower. 65 passengers are onboard.
 9:43 EDT-American Airlines Flight 77 crashes into the Pentagon. 64 die onboard.
 10:10 EDT- Hijacked United Airlines Flight 93 crashes outside a small town in Pennsylvania with 45 onboard.
 National landmarks, federal institutions and state government buildings are closed and locked.
 Civil servants are placed under protective custody. Manhattan closes down.

September 13, 2001

The FBI identifies 18 (later 19) hijackers responsible for the attacks.

September 14, 2001

The first arrest takes place when a man at an airport flashes a fake pilot's ID.

September 16, 2001

The Federal Aviation Administration says that the Pentagon ignored their warning given 12 minutes before that there was a potential hijacked plane heading to Washington.

September 17, 2001

President Bush says Osama bin Laden is the prime suspect in the 9-11 attacks. Ashcroft warns of more upcoming terrorism.

September 19, 2001

Ashcroft says the terrorists behind the attacks likely had support from other governments.

September 20, 2001

The FBI begins enlisting the aid of banks to follow the money trail.

September 22, 2001

Officials conclude that a "definite struggle" ensued on United Airlines Flight 93 that crashed into western Pennsylvania.

September 23, 2001

The US State Department offers \$25 million in reward money for information leading to an arrest of the September 11 bombing suspects.

Dear Members of the Colorado College Community,

In September, we welcomed 500 fresh faces to our campus. These first-year students came full of hope, wonder and awe. Today, they're stunned. Some are angry. A month ago, they lined up for burgers at the all-campus picnic. Today, they line up to give blood. Most students starting classes this fall were born in 1983, a few years before the Challenger explosion. Too young to remember that national catastrophe -- much less the televised coverage of the Kennedy and King assassinations -- they gather in cafeterias, dorm rooms and classrooms with other students, asking why and what now and what can I do. They want to be involved, and to try to understand. And that, frankly, is why they were selected as our class of 2005.

Since the events of September 11, we have held special gatherings for the campus community to grieve and to discuss world events. We've increased counseling services and offered more opportunities for community service. We believe that going about the business of residential college education -- though far from "business as usual" -- is the best way to honor those who have been touched by this tragedy.

It's difficult to predict what will happen in the coming weeks and months. Discussion and discourse, though, is what we do. We have for 127 years, through the world wars, the Great Depression, the McCarthy era, Vietnam. That business will continue.

In times like this, a liberal arts education is more relevant than ever before. In our classrooms, we emphasize the importance of intercultural understanding, language study, economic and political thought, and international study. We're serious about our commitment to educate students for intellectual achievement, as well as for social responsibility.

We're a small family. Our students are not anonymous here, not lost in the back of a packed lecture hall. Because we embrace community involvement on this campus, students learn early the value of community participation later in life, be it with business associates, at a school, or with a neighborhood group.

And people lean on their communities in times like this. That sense of loyalty to community you've learned in and outside the classroom means you are ready to do, to say, to act ... now, when our community needs us the most. A liberal arts education has taught you how to cultivate ideas with reason and justification. How to serve. How to think. And that means how to live.

When we welcome parents and alumni to campus at Homecoming in a few weeks, we know it will be a very different event than ever before. Many alumni have told us that connections to CC and their classmates are more important than ever.

It is my hope that your experiences at CC have helped you in some way to deal with this tragedy. When the events of the last few days fill you with anger and rage, your broader understanding of events of past centuries reminds you to stop, to listen, to think. This leadership quality means others will come to you for advice and reasoning. Rise to that call. Rely on your ties to Colorado College.

September 28, 2001

Government officials tell news agencies that planning of the attacks spanned the entire globe.

September 30, 2001

Ashcroft cites a "clear and present danger" to American citizens. He warns that once the US chooses a course of response to the attacks, terrorist activity may increase.

October 2, 2001

NATO Secretary General George Robertson says the US has presented compelling and conclusive evidence linking Osama bin Laden to the September 11 attacks.

October 4, 2001

Startlingly, Pakistan joins the cause with the US after compelling evidence is given.

October 5, 2001

Bush's antiterrorism proposals begin to gain more support in Congress after being slowed due to concerns for potential civil liberties abuses.

October 8, 2001

Ashcroft urges Americans to have a "heightened sense of awareness" but not to overreact and should "live normal lives."

October 13, 2001

Delta Airlines cancels a non-stop flight from New York to Amsterdam after two "Middle Eastern" men buy one-way tickets and two more inquire in to doing so.

October 26, 2001

Bush signs the USA Patriot Act limiting civil liberties for the next four years. Habeas Corpus is suspended for a week for any suspected terrorist. Wide-sweeping wire tapping power is given to the FBI, allowing them to tap phones without judicial authorization.

November 4, 2001

Arab nations deny Osama bin Laden's call for Jihad, or holy war, against the United States.

President Mohrman formally made the decision to leave CC this summer. She said that although her sabbatical in China gave her time to think about leaving, it did not directly contribute to her decision. "While I was in China I was teaching, and taking language lessons and Chinese painting lessons, but it wasn't as hectic of a pace as I have here. So I had a chance to read more, just kind of think and reflect and so forth — sabbaticals are designed to give people a chance to kind of renew themselves."



Also contributing to her decision to leave was Kathryn's father. He recently passed away, and President Mohrman took it as a wake-up call. "When your parents die, you kind of start to think, 'well, I'm not immortal either, and what do I really want to do with the rest of my time?' I'm sure a lot of students have had those same kinds of thoughts since September 11th."

The Turning Point : Changing Presidents.

On Monday, Richard Celeste takes the reins as Colorado College's 12th president. A former two-term Democratic governor of Ohio, and director of the U.S. Peace Corps, the 64-year-old Celeste served as U.S. ambassador to India during the Clinton administration. As only the second non-academic to head the elite, private college, Celeste replaces Kathryn Mohrman, who is leaving to accept a Fulbright fellowship in Hong Kong after nine years as president.



Indy: Why did you decide that you might want to come to CC?

Celeste: Well, I think there's several reasons. I think that an outstanding liberal-arts education is even more relevant in this 21st century than it has been in the past, because we are going to be confronted with such dramatic changes in the nature of work and the workplace, and the nature of the technology we deal with, and the nature of the world we live in. And so, a broad-based liberal arts education, I think, is vital. The second is, I discovered what I should have known about Colorado College that it's a wonderfully innovative place that really takes teaching and learning very seriously; it celebrates good teaching and celebrates learning.

But part of the challenge was, I think, also clear to me: That is, the story of Colorado College isn't very well known, certainly the further east you go. People who are in the know, know that it is an outstanding institution. But that message needs to be communicated much further.

Recruit outstanding students from a variety of backgrounds and create a climate here, and a community here, where they can learn.

Part of their learning is to understand the challenges of coping with diversity. Again, if you project it on the world we're living in today -- we watch India and Pakistan struggling with their differences; we watch the hotbeds of terrorism, and the anger and pain and frustration that are among the things that breed some of that terrorism -- then a college like Colorado College, that wants to prepare young people for positions of responsibility in that world, and with an ability to handle themselves in that world, needs to be able to wrestle with those issues on campus.

So I think there is work to be done. There's work to be done in recruiting minority students. There's work to be done in making sure that the way we engage with each other on campus is, what I would call, "de-
 respectful." By that, I mean we don't ignore differences. Rather, we really explore what it means to be a young African-American woman in the United States today, a young Hispanic man or woman who's here aspiring to a profession or a career. It's kind of celebration, and it should be kind of a celebration of the world in which we live, and I think it was precisely that spirit that was
 of sandbagged [by the article]. It wasn't funny.

Colorado College believes in freedom of speech and freedom of thought. We do not censor our student publications, just as we do not censor the ideas of our faculty, staff, trustees, or students. However, freedom of speech and freedom of thought are liberties that also carry responsibility for one's actions. And such liberties do have limits; they do not include the right to harass, injure, or silence others. While I believe that our student journalists had no intention of harming anyone, the fact is that the many readers of these articles were offended. I am deeply disappointed by this situation. It does not measure up to the highest standards of Colorado College. One of our four college priorities is a commitment to diversity, which means that we expect the members of our campus community to treat one another with tolerance and respect. Attempts at humor that come at the expense of others are simply not funny. Such feeble efforts at satire are hurtful and disappointing, not just to the groups that were targeted, but to all of us.

We are all members of the same community, whatever our roles and responsibilities. As we seek not only to honor the diversity of our community but also to expand that diversity, we challenge ourselves to greater tolerance of individual differences as we also embrace our common understanding of what it means to be human.

As members of an academic community, we will direct our efforts to combat hurtful words with positive speech and forward-looking conversation. We seek to educate ourselves about our responsibilities toward one another and our obligation to learn more about the different members of the Colorado College community. Among our commitments to that goal of greater understanding:

- CCCA and student organization leaders will have leadership workshops both this spring and next fall

- Additional support will go to the bilingual family newspaper published by the Office of Minority Student Life

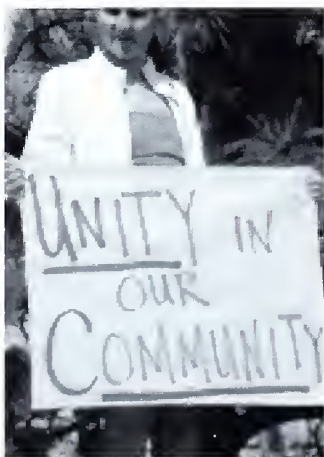
- We encourage students of color to participate more visibly in campus publications and student organizations

We will increase resources for the Diversity Council programming fund

- Senior staff will continue discussions of the opportunities and challenges of diversity at CC

Once again, I call upon all members of the Colorado College community to view this unfortunate incident as an opportunity for conversation about the true meaning of our commitment to diversity. Let us take this difficult moment to renew our commitments to one another.

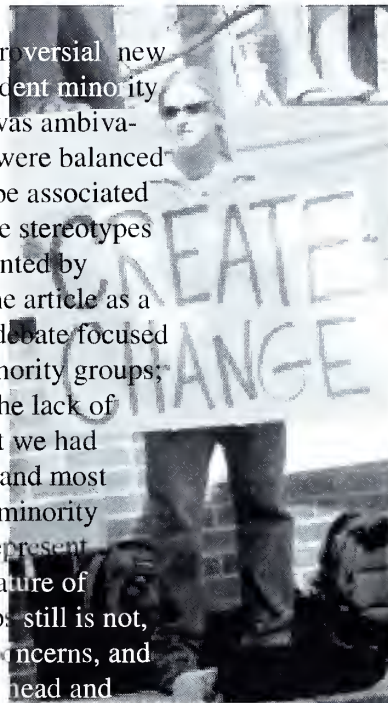

Editorial Note:

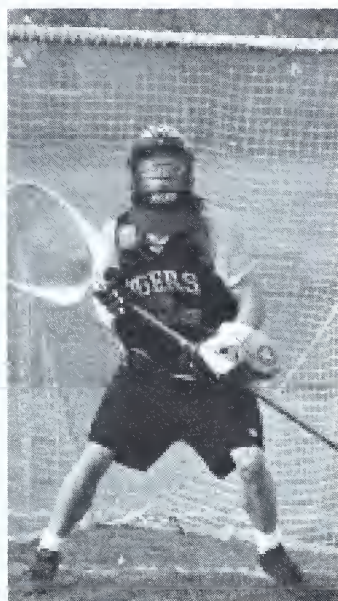
The April fool's issue of the Catalyst was a satire titled "Nickalodeon launches controversial new inter channel, Niggalodeon". On week after its distribution, a backlash from the student minority groups hit the campus, the administration, and Cutler publications. Student response was ambivalent: The overwhelming distress and anger aired at the Glass House press conference were balanced by student concerns for the sanctity of the forum of satire. Students were ashamed to be associated with or identified by the article, offended and hurt by it, or laughed at its attacks on the stereotypes placed on African Americans and white corporate culture. Neither response was presented by members of one ethnic group. And then the issues became larger, and students used the article as a touchstone to jumpstart dialogue about race in other areas of the school. Some of the debate focused on ownership of the word 'nigga'; some focused on the institutional racism felt by minority groups; some focused on how much sensitivity is too much, or not enough; some focused on the lack of synthesis between minority student groups and publications that they could claim that we had historically ignored them, and we could claim that we simply had no idea what they (and most other student groups) were doing. (editorial aside: Katherine Mormon's invitation to minority students to join publications was, inconveniently, misinterpreted as a plea that they represent themselves on the board to keep us from publishing our racist views. Somehow, the nature of student publications never really entered that part of the debate; it was not, and perhaps still is not, understood that they are a forum for every student to represent themselves and their concerns, and not a vessel for a group of professionals to represent the views of all of campus). The head and managing editors of the Catalyst, Audrey Thompson and John Traub, stepped down, and Giselle Prestepo and Karen Henderson (Vice president and president of Cutler publications) filled in for a month. State and National press got ahold of the issue, and without reading the article published responses and criticisms of the student body (most notably the Gazette columnist, Robert Schuch, who characterized students as white yuppies "Muffy and Biff" who would not be able to find jobs after college, yet would be well-versed in making fun of blacks). After the Black Student Union sent copies of the paper to the NAACP, there were rumors that they and Nickalodeon might sue the publications company. At the end of the ordeal, there were still literally no minorities on the Cutler Publications staff of board.
